MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



It has been a year of unprecedented challenges and working against the odds. The pandemic took a heavy toll on life, livelihood and health. Covid 19 posed a special health challenge to the children especially HIVinfected children because of their greater vulnerability and less immune system to be exposed to this contagious disease. With the situation being worse in smaller cities and rural areas, the government has enforced lockdown across the country which led to a lack of transportation and access to basic needs. Even facing challenges to earn their livelihood. In this unprecedented time, our first priority was to ensure the safety of the children. Our premises was shut down but we continued to work by supporting the suffering needy. In this period, we have supported 20000+ People Living with HIV in rural areas by providing healthcare at the doorstep.

After the end of the first phase of the pandemic, we resumed our programs and started our skill-based education that helped 1300 underprivileged children to acquire skills such as computer education, art & craft, and more. After the reopening of the schools, we also distributed school kits to around 1400+ children. Meanwhile, as the world shifted to a virtual landscape, the children are trained and equipped with digital resources for their learning.

Our staff, volunteers and teachers are at the frontline of our ecosystem. They have shown tremendous zeal and enthusiasm in transforming the lives of HIV-infected and underprivileged children we work with.

Our story is incomplete without making a mention of our supportive donors -individuals, foundations, as well as Corporates who backed us even when they were facing challenges in this hard time. Many of them have been with us for over 10 years. Their faith and confidence in us have enabled our journey so far. As we progress our aim remains intact – enabling medically challenged and underprivileged children an independent and dignified life.

OUR VISION & MISSION

To **realize** a world without the Stigma & Discrimination attached to HIV/AIDS & empowering Children afflicted with this disease.

To **enable** medically challenged and underprivileged children to live an independent and dignified life.

Mahesh Foundation has been working for the welfare of HIV-positive and underprivileged children for the past 13 years. The Foundation is providing shelter, nutrition, healthcare, and education to HIV-positive and underprivileged children. Our core focus over the last decade has been to provide education to these children so that they live dignified lives.

In the past 13 years, the Foundation's Care Home has directly benefited over 700 girls and 1100 boys. Our Community Support program has impacted the lives of 32000 HIV-infected socially disadvantaged families. Also, raised awareness among more than 3 lakh school and college students. The Foundation commenced a school, "Utkarsha" for HIV-positive special children as well as underprivileged children in 2018 and benefited around 1300 HIV-positive and underprivileged children.



So, Mahesh Foundation started providing skill-based education such as computers, art & craft, theater, dance and more to them as well as the government school children who are unfortunate enough to get it in their schools.

Mahesh Foundation started initiatives during the year 2020-21. The donation box campaign is a program that encourages people to contribute to society. Prayatna... for a better society is an endeavor to extend a helping hand to the needy to meet their various needs like education, healthcare and more.

SURVIVING THE WORST

TOGETHER WE CAN HELP STOP THE SPREAD

COVID -19 has impacted billions of lives around the globe. Government, Individuals, Businesses and civil society organizations are battling to save lives. During these unprecedented times, the role of NGOs has become paramount in combating the coronavirus and its impacts on society's most vulnerable populations, especially in countries and regions where government services are struggling like in India. For the grassroots Organizations, like Mahesh Foundation the pandemic has imposed multiple challenges which include all aspects of its work - from running programs, planning finances, exploring resources, arranging logistics, meeting the urgent needs of the targeted people, managing human resources, staffing and safety motivation of implementation team and most importantly the budgetary constraints and uncertainties.















"Progress Towards LIGHT and HOPE"

Any community is not lonely in the fight against COVID-19, triumph over the pandemic is not impossible once 130 crore Indians unite against it. Amid the darkness spread by the pandemic, we must continuously progress toward light and hope. We must support those most affected by the crisis by spreading the glory of light tonight at 9 PM for 9 valuable minutes. Used Diya and Candles, and spread the light in all 4 directions. Through this, the children passed a message that we Indians are united against the Corona pandemic.

Humanity towards Community

The founder visited slums to evaluate the situation of dwellers and to support them by fulfilling their basic needs in critical situations. The people in these slums are daily wage workers and lock-down has adversely affected their earnings. All 200 families are suffering to make ends meet. To fulfill their basic needs for a meal, we distributed the grocery kits to these families.

COVID-19 awareness session

The world-famous Professional Photographer Mr. Vicky Roy was live on Mahesh Foundation's Instagram page to raise awareness on COVID-19 and its precautions. During his awareness session he informed the importance of Why people should wear MASKS. Masks are a key measure to reduce transmission and save lives. Wearing well-fitted masks should be used as part of a comprehensive 'Do it all!' approach including maintaining physical distancing, avoiding crowded, closed and close-contact settings, ensuring good ventilation of indoor spaces, cleaning hands regularly, and covering sneezes and coughs with a tissue of bent elbow.

Stay Clean, Stay Safe

As a precautionary measure against the COVID-19 pandemic, Mahesh Foundation sealed down and prohibited the outsiders into the premises. The children are less immune and any disease can easily infect them. The whole premise has been cleaned regularly and sanitized to maintain cleanliness and hygiene in the premise.

Healthcare at the Doorstep

HIV positive people couldn't visit hospitals and get their medicines. There is no transportation to travel to the hospitals so, our Mahesh Foundation team has reached their doorstep to supply the needed medication.

ASHAKIRANOur Care Home

The project focuses mainly on Orphan, Semi Orphan and Destitute Children who are affected or infected by HIV AIDS and referred through the ARTC center or by any Child Welfare Committee in Karnataka. Due to death of HIV/AIDS infected and affected persons, Remarriage of deserted / widowed/divorced women, absence of love and security in the families, Family disputes, Unwanted pregnancy of trafficked / Sexually exploited girls; these orphans and are sometimes left in the streets without care and support.

Thus, most of the children end up as rag pickers, pickpockets and indulge in various anti-social & even criminal activities. Keeping the vision in mind to provide care, support & protection to these children in their formative years so that they become productive citizens of tomorrow, all the necessary arrangements like School, tuition, nutritious food, healthy shelter (etc) are properly in place.

The shelter home is currently located at Siddheshwar Nagar, Kanabargi, Belagavi, Karnataka State, with 45 children sheltered in the Child Care Home with 3 residential staff and 5 non-residential staff members working in it.

We have reached more than 1800+ HIV-infected children to support their education, healthcare, and other basic needs that help them shape a bright future. We have been providing nutrition, healthcare, and education in our care home. Many children who enrolled in our care home are living healthy and independent lives.



Every month, we conduct a health assessment of the children to ensure that they are fit and healthy. Dr. Amey Usulkar, our medical In-charge has assessed the health of the children.



Blood Donation Camp:

Blood donation is one of the best social helps one can do. Mahesh Foundation in collaboration with The Belgaum Aqua Valves Pvt. Ltd organized a blood donation camp.



ChildLine Child rights awareness program:

The ChildLine team organized the Child Rights Awareness program at Mahesh Foundation. District Magistrate Shri. Vijay Devaraj Urs, ChildLine Coordinator Shri. M. K. Kundaragi, member of CWC Mr. F. S. Patil, member of Child Rights Protection Committee Mrs. Bharati Valvekar, and others were present.



UTKARSHA LEARNING CENTER

A special school that teaches first-generation learners how to learn.

A school for medically challenged and underprivileged children. The school provides a learning environment that is free from discrimination. Constituted some committees such as sports, health, education, and food among others. 5 children were included in each group. This will give a piece of knowledge about the committee and the responsibilities that children should know. Utkarsha Learning Center is well-equipped with the facilities required to ensure international quality education.

With the support of individuals and corporate investors, we have created the best-in-class infrastructure, suited for first-generation learners. We at Utkarsh stand by its values and we are committed to providing the best education to the disadvantaged, underprivileged & neglected children of the society.

Utkarsha's Activities:

Commemorating Kargil Diwas:

Kargil war has been one of the greatest wars that were fought by India. Many brave soldiers were martyred in the war. At Mahesh Foundation the children commemorated their martyrdom and paid tribute to the brave soldiers.

Diksha online classes:

Children at Mahesh Foundation's care home have attended the online classes of DIKSHA under the guidance of social worker Ashwini Naganur. As schools are closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Doubtless, education is the most powerful catalyst for social transformation. But, there is enormous inequality in access to quality education in India, resulting in massive inequality of opportunity for children. There are many unmet needs for basic learning material among the children.

Mahesh Foundation aims to make less privileged children self-reliant and lead a dignified life in the future. To date, Mahesh Foundation is externally supporting more than 7,000 children to get an education through the community program.

School Kit Distribution

In collaboration with Touch Foundation Mumbai, we distributed school kits to the children studying in Alataga and Ninganatti Government School, Belagavi. Around 200 children benefited from this initiative. We have been supporting this school for the past 8 years.



Impact

With all our benefactors We have been able to touch the lives of more than 7,000 children through this initiative. Many slum-dwelling children have completed their education and are working in various institutions or preparing for competitive exams like civil services.





THE SCHOOL IN THE CLOUD

The School in the cloud is an initiative inspired by Mr. Sugata Mitra, a professor of Educational Technology. This helps them in self-organized learning with digital technology. There are no facilities for the latest technology in the homes of these children. The School in the cloud is needed for such children. So, Mahesh Foundation had planned to set up a lab in the cloud that impacts the learning of children who lack such privileges at home.

Impact:

This is an innovative way of learning which helps students in **SELF ORGANIZED LEARNING**.

This helps the HIV-infected children who have been provided shelter at Mahesh Foundation, slum children who are learning in Utkarsha Learning Center and 500-600 children to explore new things by themselves. Using technology children can communicate with other communities. These resources are used well to learn new things.



SCHOOL ADOPTION PROGRAM

The number of children studying in government schools is higher than the private schools. Despite government efforts to transform the government schools, the schools are lacking infrastructure facilities and that leads to failure to attract the students to government schools as well as to provide quality education to needy children. The objective of this initiative is to strengthen the infrastructure and education quality of these schools.

During the year 2020-21, we were intended to reach 7000 underprivileged children under various educational programs. As we all know, the deadly COVID-19 pandemic has forced schools to remain closed for a long time. So, we have paused our educational programs until the schools reopen.

Jnanpith Awardees:



AMBITIONS

Girls Hostel

At Mahesh Foundation we have provided separate facilities for boys and girls in the same premises. It contains all amenities that children need. But, the Child Welfare Department has directed all the Child Care Institutions in India to maintain separate premises for the boys and girls and this made us build new premises. If we fail to do so, then we have to send either girls or boys back to the home. As the children are orphans and abandoned by their relatives, it will be difficult for them to lead their life.

Hence, we have decided to construct new premises for girls for their accommodation. With the support of many corporations, we are able to complete the construction, now we are seeking support for basic facilities for the children. This new premises will benefit more than 250 girl children to get free Shelter, Education, Medical Support and Nutrition.

Skill Development Center

To encourage skills among medically challenged and underprivileged women and girls, we are building a skill center. This will benefit the unemployed unskilled women and girls who are illiterate or college dropouts.

To empower 200 underprivileged women and school dropout girls through skill development training in selected market-driven courses such as basic Computers, Tailoring, Art & Craft and communication & Soft skills. Further, the project would help increase employment opportunities for these underprivileged girls and women.

Being a medically challenged girl, Pooja Bandiwaddar's journey that she is today was not easy. While HIV/AIDS is considered stigma and discrimination by society, Mahesh Foundation believed in her ability. She is medically challenged since birth and also her parents. Because of their unstable health condition, they were unable to provide much-needed nutrition and education.

So, her parents enrolled her in Mahesh Foundation's Ashakiran care home. Pooja was positive that this would be the right place for her. Mahesh Foundation provided her with the platform which helped her study, develop skills, and become self-sustained. She was taken care of by Mahesh Foundation providing nutrition, healthcare as well as timely counseling and moral support.

Pooja completed her Secondary Education and she was post-integrated into her family. Currently, Pooja runs a dairy business for her livelihood. Also, she got married.
